Duties and Responsibilities:

- •Provide services for students with an Individualized Educational Program (IEP) in areas of mental health, including but not limited to, counseling, parent counseling and training, psychological services, and social work services.
- •Coordinate district development of policies and procedures regarding identification (assessment) and provision of special education services, to include educationally related mental health services, in accordance with the laws and regulations set forth in the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEIA).
- •Collaborate with district administrators in program planning, monitoring and service coordination to insure student access to a full continuum of special education services, to include educationally related mental health services.
- •Support schools in maximizing student achievement through data-based decision making and implementation of research-based instructional practices to address social and emotional barriers to learning.
- •Support Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams in their implementation and coordination of services, to include educationally related mental health services offered within the IEP.
- •Serve as a resource to the district in the assessment and provision of services of special education students whose educationally related mental health needs require intensive intervention.
- •Provide IEP case management for special education students requiring educational placement outside of district (e.g., Non public schools).
- •Coordinate staff development to addresses district need in area(s) of instructional methodologies, curriculum resources and delivery of special education services, to include educationally related mental health services.
