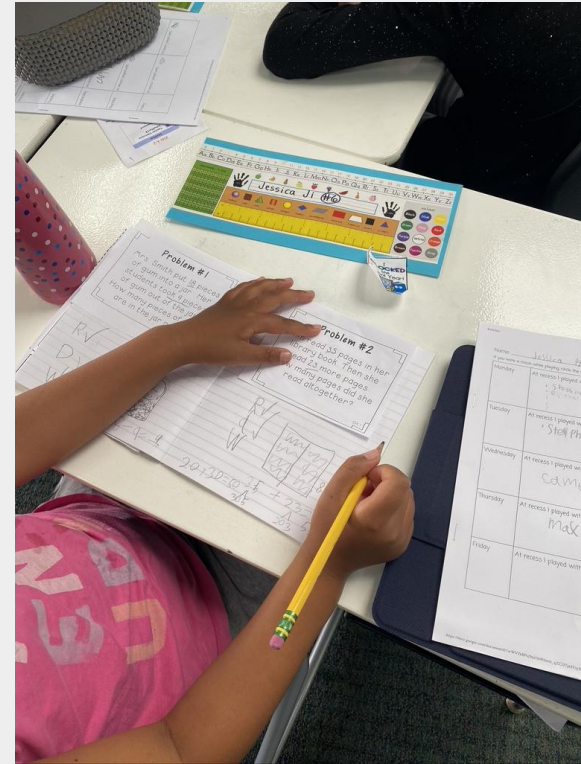

Ventilation Update

Indoor Air Quality is not just about preventing airborne illnesses

- **Health benefits that go beyond disease transmission, include support for:**
 - Asthma
 - Absenteeism due to chronic illnesses
 - Outdoor air pollutants penetrating indoor buildings
 - Decreased respiratory symptoms
- **Academic benefits**
 - Reading
 - Mathematics
 - Fewer missed school days
 - Higher scores on cognitive function tests



Ventilation Update



In Progress:

- Ongoing intermittent commissioning (every three to five years)
 - June 2020 - All classroom units converted to MERV 13 filters
 - 2020-21 School Year -
 - MERV filters changed quarterly
 - Six air changes hourly
 - Two and a Half (2 1/2) outside air exchanges hourly
 - 2021-22 School Year -
 - MERV filters changed quarterly
 - Six air changes hourly
 - Three (3) outside air exchanges hourly

Next Steps:

- Engage P2S, Inc., to conduct another mechanical evaluation to make recommendations for long-term indoor air quality
 - September 9-October 7, 2021
- District staff proceeds with P2S, Inc., recommendations throughout the evaluation process
 - Estimating \$1600 per classroom

Preparing for In-Person Board Meetings

- Executive Order N-29-20 (clarified by Executive Order N-56-20), permitting Boards of Education to hold teleconference or videoconference meetings will expire on Sept. 30, 2021, unless extended or new legislation is enacted.
- Board of Education and District Staff have appreciated:
 - Broader community involvement :
 - Attendance
 - Opportunities for greater community participation
 - Orally addressing the Board of Education
 - Submitting Written comments



An In-Person/Livestream Model

- This model allows the Board of Education, District Staff, and community participants to:
 - Attend an in-person meeting fulfilling Brown Act requirements
 - Attendees may address the Board of Education personally by completing a speaker card prior to the commencement of the meeting, or
 - Attend virtually via live streaming
 - Attendees may submit written comments by completing an electronic speaker form before the commencement of the meeting to be read aloud
- Thursday, September 23, 2021, a Special Board meeting is scheduled around the topic of *Student Academic Performance* for the Board of Education, District Staff, and the community to “field test” this approach prior to the Executive Order expiring.
