

Expanded Learning Opportunity Program (ELO-P) 2022-2023

The Expanded Learning Opportunity Program (ELO-P) is funded through Assembly Bill 130 and provides after-school and intersession learning programs for qualifying students.

"Expanded learning" refers to: after-school, summer, or intersession learning programs that focus on supporting the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of students through hands-on, engaging learning experiences.

The ELO-P is offered through the Solana Beach School District's Child Development Center (CDC)

Hours of Operation: School dismissal to 6:00 p.m.

Days of Operation: All school days

Location: The CDC provides the ELO-P at all seven SBSD school sites during the school year.

Summer locations to be determined

Program components include:

- Literacy and enrichment activities
- Physical activity
- Safe environment that promotes emotional wellness and building relationships
- Afternoon snack

Student Eligibility for free ELO-P Enrollment

Students enrolled in SBSD schools who are:

- Eligible for Free or Reduced-price Lunch, as Determined by the Household Income
- Classified as Foster Youth
- Experiencing Homelessness

Students who do not qualify for free enrollment based on the criteria above, may still participate in the fee-based Child Development Center programs.
