# An Idea that Promotes Choice

- Siblings may stay together K through sixth grade; OR
- Families may choose for their child(ren) to experience an intermediate level of growth prior to attending middle school by attending Solana Pacific with a grades 4-6 configuration (Intradistrict Process)

# Original Timeline Considerations:

2024-25 - When Solana Highlands was being considered for PHR student attendance

2021-22 - Following the interim housing of Solana Vista students during construction



Option 1 (2021-22): First year with fourth (4th) grade students

Option 2 (2021-22): First year with fourth (4th) and (5th) grade students (students would have the option to return to SH from SP for 5th and 6th grade).

Option 3 (2020-21) - First year with fourth grade with a decision to consolidate speciality program rooms for the one year to accommodate conversion and interim housing.

Option 4 (2020-21): First year with fourth (4th) grade students (Solana Vista kindergarten and first graders at SH, with second graders housed at Skyline).

- Both former Solana Highlands principals (K-3 configuration)
- Currently both K-6 principals
  - Solana Ranch
  - Solana Santa Fe





#### **Principal Insights**

- 1. There are a variety of mentoring opportunities possible when older students serve as role models for younger students
- 2. Stronger community is created due to families engaging in a single school for a longer period of time
- 3. There is more investment by families for fundraising
- 4. Greater ability for teachers to focus on holistic learning experiences from K-6 vertical planning and articulation

## **Teacher Perspectives**

#### Ms. Lefkowitz

- Current CRT
- Has taught in all configurations of students (SV, SH)

#### Ms. Magalnick

- Current STREAM TOSA
- Has taught in all configurations of students (DO, SP, SR, SH)



#### **Teacher Insights**

- Vertical alignment for planning academics and activities when all students are at the same site
- 2. More opportunities for peer modeling and interactions to foster a culture of community over a greater age span
- 3. SH has been K-6, K-4, and K-3. It has been successful in all mixes. The site and teachers are well-prepared to welcome upper grades.
- If upper grades attend SH in 2020-2021, the impact of both SV interim students and additional classes/ growth will be taxing on Discovery Labs and student services
