Compensation listed per cell represents the following:
 Line 1: Annual compensation for staff working 8.0 hours daily, 260 days annually.
 Line 2: Monthly compensation for staff working 8.0 hours daily.
 Line 3: Hourly compensation.

New unit members, as defined as members who became employees of the district on/after July 1, 2004, who have public or nonpublic work experience in the same or comparable classification and/or job-related field will be given up to four (4) years of prior experience credit upon initial placement (maximum initial placement Step 5).

A longevity* compensation increment will be added for staff for continuous years of service with the District. This increment shall be calculated using the percentages listed below, multiplied by the current base pay rate earnings:
 - During the 8, 9 and 10th continuous year of classified service with the District, a 3% multiplier is used.
 - During the 11, 12 and 13th continuous year of classified service with the District, a 6.09% multiplier is used.
 - During the 14, 15 and 16th continuous year of classified service with the District, a 9.27% multiplier is used.
 - During the 17, 18 and 19th continuous year of classified service with the District, a 12.55% multiplier is used.
 - During each of the 20th+ continuous year of classified service with the District, a 15.93% multiplier is used.

Staff possessing a Master's Degree (MS) shall have \$1,750 added to their annual compensation. No more than one (1) MS shall be considered for this added compensation.

*The longevity increment shall be prorated for part-time (less than eight hours) employees.

No additional staff shall be paid from this salary schedule. This schedule is to sunset upon termination of all staff currently referenced by a Staff ID number above.

Longevity:

A career* compensation increment will be added for staff who have completed continuous years of service as follows:

An amount equal to eight percent (8%) of BASE (Range 21, Step 1) during the 14th-16th years,

An amount equal to 2 X eight percent (8%) of BASE (Range 21, Step 1) during the 17th-19th year,

An amount equal to 3 X eight percent (8%) of BASE (Range 21, Step 1) during the 20th-22nd year,

An amount equal to 4 X eight percent (8%) of BASE (Range 21, Step 1) during the 23rd-25th year, and

An amount equal to 5 X eight percent (8%) of BASE (Range 21, Step 1) during the 26th year of service and ongoing.

(For the current salary schedule, the eight percent (8%) of BASE (Range 21, Step 1) is equal to \$3,255.21 (Full-Time))

Additionally, beginning the 14th year, a longevity* increment of \$1,000 will be added to the annual salary each year.

Staff possessing a Master's Degree (MS) shall have \$1,750 added to their annual compensation.

No more than one (1) MS shall be considered for this added compensation.

*The career and longevity increments shall be prorated for part-time (less than eight hours) employees.
