## PARENT INFORMATION MEETING FOR GLOBAL EDUCATION

# **Primary Global Ed. News**

#### FIVE SENSES PAPER BAG SHARING January 13-20

The primary classes are beginning a science unit about our five senses this month. As part of this science unit, the children will be learning about how we experience the world through our five senses: taste, touch, sight, smell and hearing. The children will need to select an interesting object to be placed in a paper bag for this topic sharing. They will then need to write a list of clues (one clue for each sense) to present to the class on sharing day. The class will try and guess what object is in the bag based on the "five senses" clues presented.

#### CREATE A SARCOPHAGUS January 27-31

#### ONE HUNDRED ITEMS MUSEUM (February 3-7)

Help your child find something interesting to count and bring in for the 100 museum. It is fun to see if the children can create the lightest/heaviest collection, the most colorful, the funniest, etc. Collection size will be limited to what students can carry all by themselves. This collection is to be brought in on your child's sharing day. Please label your collection with your child's name.



We continue our march through ancient history with a focus on the ancient Egyptians. One of the more fascinating aspects of ancient Egyptian life was their belief about the afterlife and how one needed to bring along necessary items for use after death. For this sharing, your child will need to find a shoebox to represent a sarcophagus. The sarcophagus should be filled with items your child would like and or need in the afterlife. The items can be real (like a baseball) or photos/models/ drawings of items too large to store in the shoebox sarcophagus. Your child should also generate a list of the items stored in the sarcophagus and a REASON why each item was included. Your child may decorate his/her sarcophagus (think of the lavish sarcophagus of King Tut!).
