### THE GLOBAL ED. FASHION SHOW AND CLOTHING PRESENTATION

February 4, 2022

The children in Global Ed. have begun to examine the role clothing plays in our community, from the clothing required in the different jobs in our community to the resources used in creating the clothing. As part of this focus, every child in Global Ed. will participate in a "fashion show" or clothing presentation. The children in the K-4 part of our program will work with students in their classrooms to learn about the clothing from either a specific time period or the clothing worn for specific occupations. The children will prepare short pantomimes of scenarios highlighting their time period or occupation. The students in Ms. Campbell's and Mrs. Emily's classes will create presentations focusing on the process of making clothing and clothing from different cultures. These scenarios and informative pieces will be filmed and available for viewing for a limited time through a password protected link. ### **DESIGN A T-SHIRT**

(February 7-11)

This sharing provides an opportunity for the fashion designer in your child to be expressed. Each child will create a design on a paper T-shirt form provided by the child's teacher. The design should cover both the front and the back of the T-shirt. Any art materials may be used in the design from paint and crayons to sequins and feathers. Your child should be ready to talk about the thought process that went into the design.

## ONE HUNDRED COLLECTIONS (January 18-21)

Help your child find something interesting to count and bring in for sharing (baseball cards, buttons, pennies...there are so many possibilities!). Students in Mrs. Anderson and Ms. Mac Mitchell's classes are asked to bring in 1,000 items for sharing. All of the 100's and 1,000's collections will be on display in the '100's Museum' on the morning we celebrate the 100th Day of School on Friday January 28th. It is fun to see if the children can create the lightest/heaviest collection, the most colorful, the funniest, etc. Collection size will be limited to what students can carry all by themselves. The collections will be returned to the children to take home on January 28h after our 100th Day
