Children's storytelling, writing, public speaking and filmmaking will be celebrated at Skyline during Literacy Week, May 22-31. Each day there will be an activity to showcase an aspect of literacy. The events will include: "an open mic" with students reciting memorized poems, a Young Authors' Faire to share the published works of student authors to be read and responded to by other students, a celebration of poetry, and our annual Skydance Film Festival. Children may choose to create three-minute videos at home that show a story with a clear beginning, middle and end. Many children will also be a part of a class video written and filmed at school. Global Education students will soon learn about the Skydance Film Festival from their teachers. May 22-31 promises to be a wonderful celebration of literacy. 
